

# 25-26-223T Crochet Mittens

## Materials

- Pierrot Yarns Sweet Colorful [95% acrylic, 5% nylon; 115 yds/105m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #4; 2 skeins [80g] – *discontinued; please choose appropriate substitute*
- 3.5mm (US E) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

## Gauge

Gauge is measured in a swatch 10cm/4" square.

- front *or* back post double crochet (US): 16 stitches and 11.5 rows

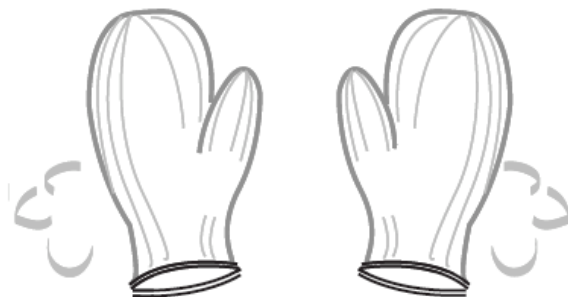
## Finished measurements

- palm circumference 18.5cm/7.28"
- length 22.5cm/8.86"

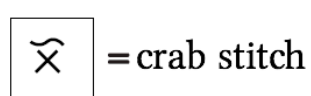
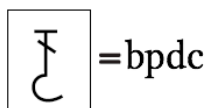
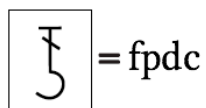
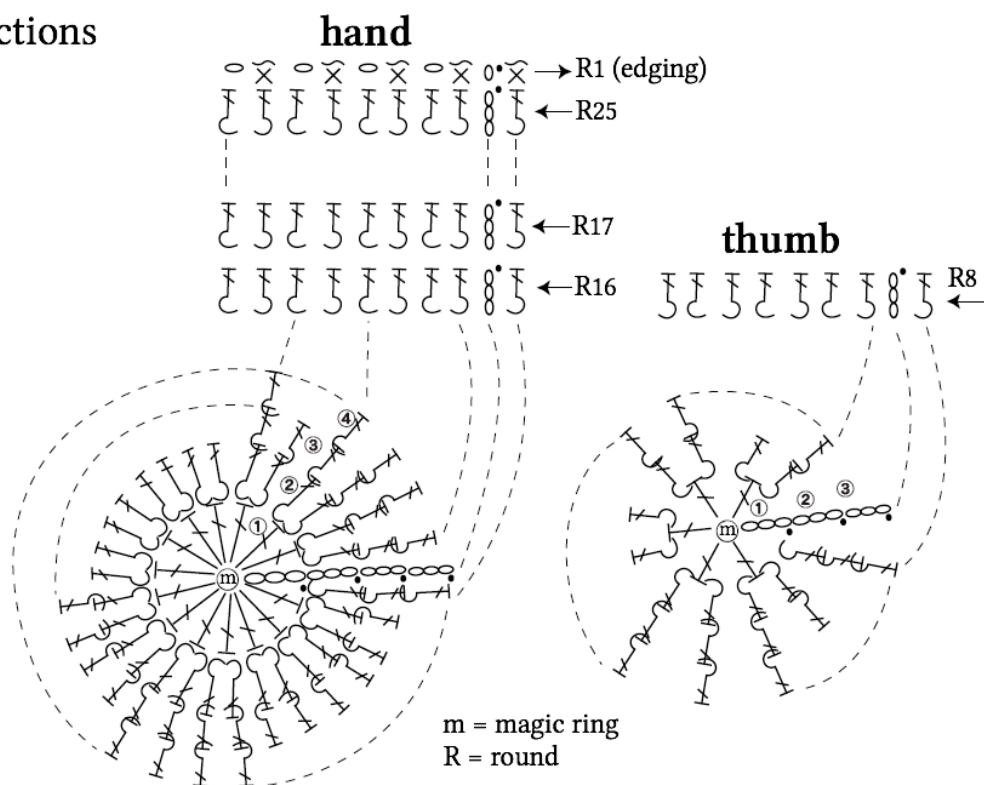
## Crochet Tips

For thumb, create magic loop; ch3 in loop to form turning post and work 5 dc into loop (for a total of 6 sts). In round 2, increase to 12 sts. ch3 for turning post, then work \*fpdc, bpdc\* into each remaining stitch. Work through round 8 without increasing or decreasing. Make two of the same thumb. Work hand through round 16 following same general pattern as thumb; attach thumb according to schematic. Starting from round 17, work thumb together with hand. Work through round 25 without increasing or decreasing, then work last round in crab stitch. Make second mitten, placing thumb mirror-image to the first mitten.

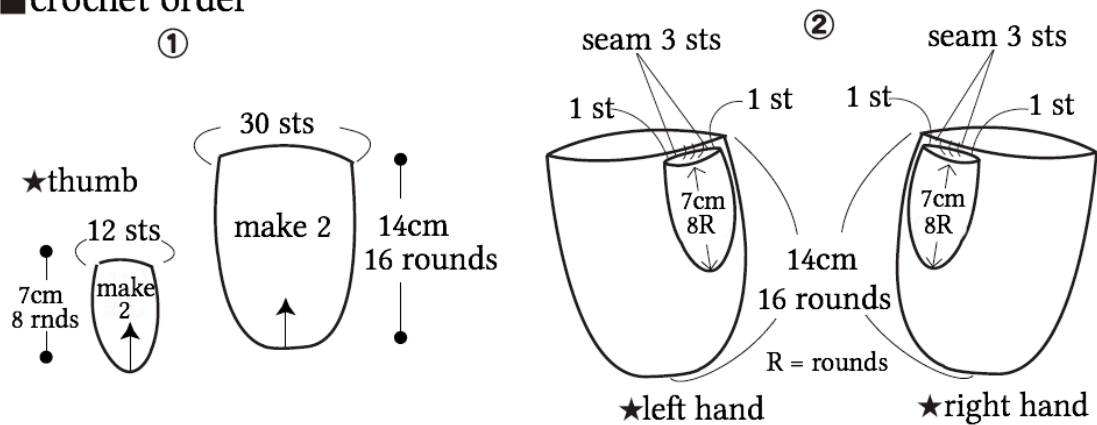
**Abbreviations:** ch = chain; dc = double crochet; fpdc = front post double crochet; bpdc = back post double crochet; *note that this pattern uses US crochet conventions.*

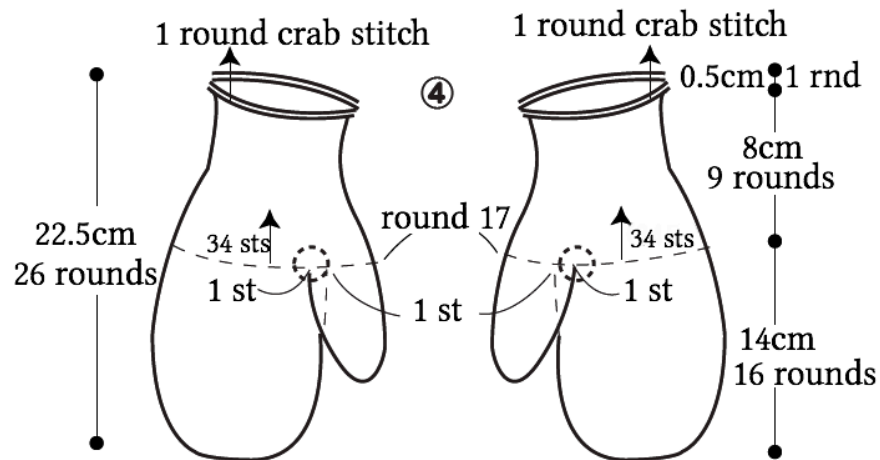
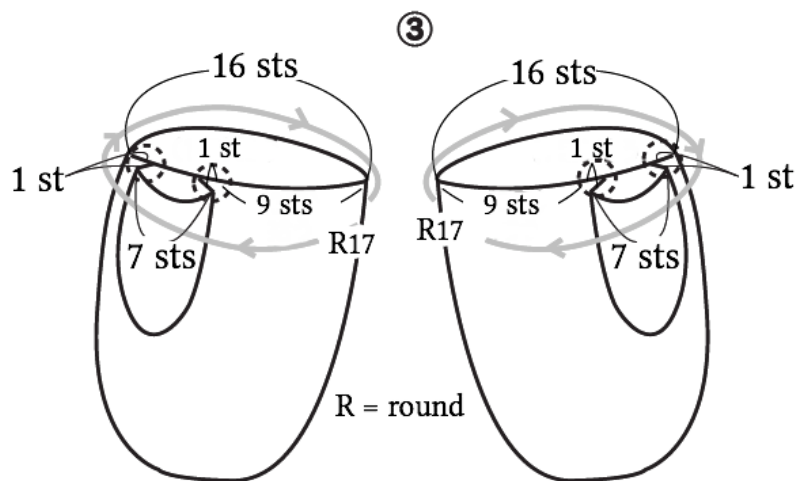


## ■ instructions

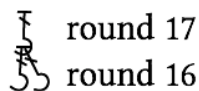


## ■ crochet order




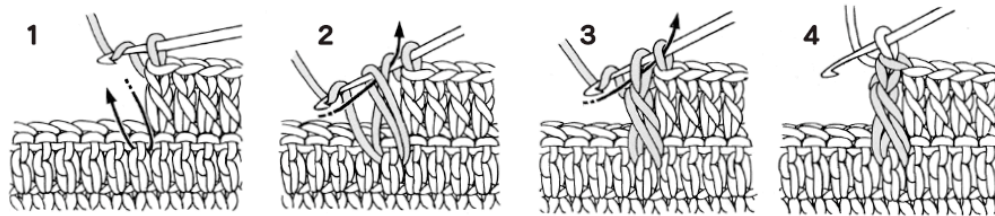



⊖ = On round 17 where thumb and palm of hand meet, crochet 2 together. Use post stitch as shown at right:

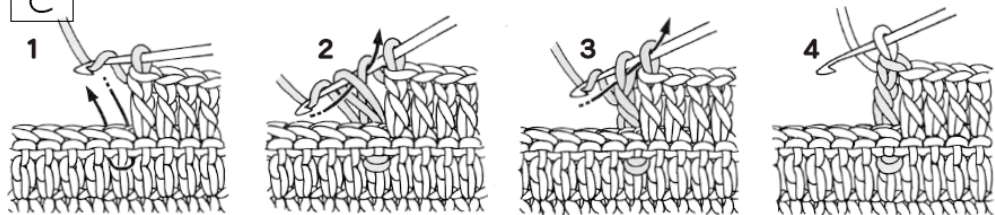


Work even from round 18 through round 25 (i.e., no increases or decreases).  
Work last round in crab stitch.

 = instructions for front post double crochet (US)



 = instructions for back post double crochet (US)



※By alternating fpdc and bpdc, you will get ribbing similar to k1p1 ribbing (in knitting).
