210-15 Tunic & Armwarmers

Materials

- Pierrot Yarns Amijin Ramie Blend [80% organic cotton, 20% ramie; 76 yds/71m per 1.06 oz./30g skein];
 - tunic: color #1 off-white; 10 skeins [280g]
 - armwarmers: color #1 off-white; 4 skeins [110g]
- 3.3mm (approx. US 3) and 3.6mm (approx. US 4 or 5) straight knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- *tunic only:* 3.3mm (approx. US 3) double-pointed knitting needles
- 3.0mm (approx. US C or D) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

Gauge

Gauge is measured in a swatch 10cm/4" square.

- tunic: pattern stitch A: 22 sts and 24 rows
- tunic: pattern stitch B & stockinette stitch: 22 sts and 26 rows
- armwarmers: pattern stitch with 3.3mm needles: 29 sts and 30 rows
- armwarmers: pattern stitch with 3.6mm needles: 25 sts and 28 rows

Finished measurements

- tunic:
 - bust 86cm/33.86"
 - cross back width 37.5cm/14.76"
 - length 68.5cm/26.97"

• armwarmers:

- hand circumference 23cm/9.06"
- length 46cm/18.11"

Knitting Tips

Tunic body: Cast on with long-tail cast-on and knit in pattern stitch A and B. On the first row of garter stitch, decrease to 95 stitches, spacing decreases evenly spaced across. Knit 4 rows garter stitch, then begin knitting in stockinette stitch.


Tunic finishing: Join shoulders with three-needle bind-off. Seam sides with mattress stitch. Work armhole and neckline edging in the round.


Tunic corsage: Crochet motifs A and B; center B on top of A and sew securely.

Armwarmers: Cast on with long-tail cast-on and knit in pattern stitch. In order to change gauge, starting with row 71, change needle size.


Armwarmer finishing: Seam sides using mattress stitch. To create a hole for thumb, leave 12 rows unseamed. Make ribbons and attach to armwarmers.









