# 29-golf Golf Club Covers

#### Materials

- Pierrot Yarns Cotton Neat [100% cotton; 58 yds/53m per 1.41 oz./40g skein];
  - color #601 ivory; 1 skein [5g]
  - color #610 red; 1 skein [5g]
  - color #625 black; 3 skeins [94g]
- Pierrot Yarns Kirakira Kids [98% acrylic, 2% polyester; 47 yds/43m per 1.06 oz./30g skein]; color #38 red; 1 skein [30g]
- 3.9mm (approx. US 6) and 4.5mm (US 7) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- darning needle

#### Gauge

Gauge is measured in a swatch 10cm/4" square.

- k2p2 ribbing (with 3.9mm needles): 21 sts and 24 rows
- k3p1 ribbing (with 4.5mm needles): 17 sts and 21 rows

#### Finished measurements

- club head circumference approx. 20cm/7.87"
- length (not incl. pompom) approx. 44cm/17.32"


#### **Knitting Tips**


Cast on and knit 14 rows with 4.5mm needles in k2p2 ribbing according to schematics. Starting from row 15, change to 3.9mm needles and knit 46 more rows in k2p2 ribbing. Next, change to color #601 ivory and 4.5m needles. Knit in k3p1 ribbing. *\*Refer to schematics for color sequence.* 

Bind off top and seam shut. Seam sides with mattress stitch. Make pompom with one skein each of #625 black and #38 red and a 20cm/7.87"-wide piece of cardboard. Attach to top of cover.

Because the mouth of the cover stretches quite easily, gauge is a little tight to compensate.






With yarn at front, insert right needle from R to L as shown.





Place yarn over R needle and bring needle to back as shown.



With new stitch now on R needle, drop stitch off L needle.




Completed purl stitch.

### knit 2 together (k2tog)




Knit up until right before the 2 stitches to be knit together.






Insert R needle from L to R into 2 stitches indicated in step 1. Place yarn over R needle and knit both stitches together.



Complete: 2 stitches are now 1 stitch.


## •mattress stitch






Pass needle under bar between first and second stitches from right edge. Repeat at left edge. Continue this on every row.


## • seaming when both pieces are bound off a' = a' = a'



Insert needle from back of a to front, then insert from back to front through a'.



Insert needle from right to left behind stitch forming  $\land$  shape.



Insert needle from right to left behind stitch forming  $\lor$  shape on other piece. Repeat steps 2 and 3.
