Materials

- Pierrot Yarns Orange [100% merino wool; 175 yds/160m per 1.76 oz./50g skein];
 - version A: color #03 red/blue/yellow/green; 1 skein [45g]
 - version B: color #04 red/brown; 1 skein [45g]
- 3.0mm (US 2½) and 3.3mm (approx. US 3) circular knitting needles (23cm/9" long) or sizes necessary to achieve gauge—double-pointed needles can also be used
- tapestry needle

Gauge

• stockinette stitch: 23 sts and 35 rows = 10cm/4" square

Finished measurements

- foot length 22cm/8.66"
- ankle circumference 21cm/8.27"

Knitting Tips


Version A: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method and begin knitting from the cuff down. Work in k2p2 ribbing, then continue in stockinette stitch. After finishing tip of toes, graft toe stitch with Kitchener stitch.


Version B: Cast on as for version A. Work in k1p1 ribbing, then continue in stockinette stitch. After finishing, graft with Kitchener stitch.

* Change needle size as indicated in schematic. Refer to schematic for heel instructions.

Abbreviations: CO = cast on; N =

needles; OH = on hold (on stitch holder or waste yarn); PU = pick up; RE = row(s) even





* Note: Align fabric, seam by forming 1 row of stitches such that old stitches align.

* Sole measurement matches size of foot, but to account for stretching, sock is slightly shorter.

in the round Sock is easily knit on either 23cm/9" mini circular needles or 4 short double-pointed needles. If using 4 DPNs, divide stitches evenly on 3 needles sole instep when casting on and knit in the round. PU 24 sts Increase by inserting needle continue into the space < = k2tog between stitches and knitting. 24 sts OH stockinette stitch version A: k2p2 rib (CO row)
