

amicomo7-15 Mitten Scarf

Materials

- Pierrot Yarns Orange [100% merino wool; 175 yds/160m per 1.76 oz./50g skein]; color #01 pink/beige; 3 skeins [115g]
- Pierrot Yarns Soft Merino Fingering [100% merino wool; 183 yds/167m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #01 ivory; 1 skein [35g]
- 3.5mm (US E) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

Gauge

Gauge measured in a swatch 10cm/4" square.

- pattern stitch A (stripes): 23 sts and 16 rows
- single crochet (US): 23 sts and 26 rows

Finished measurements

- length 160cm/62.99"

Crochet Tips

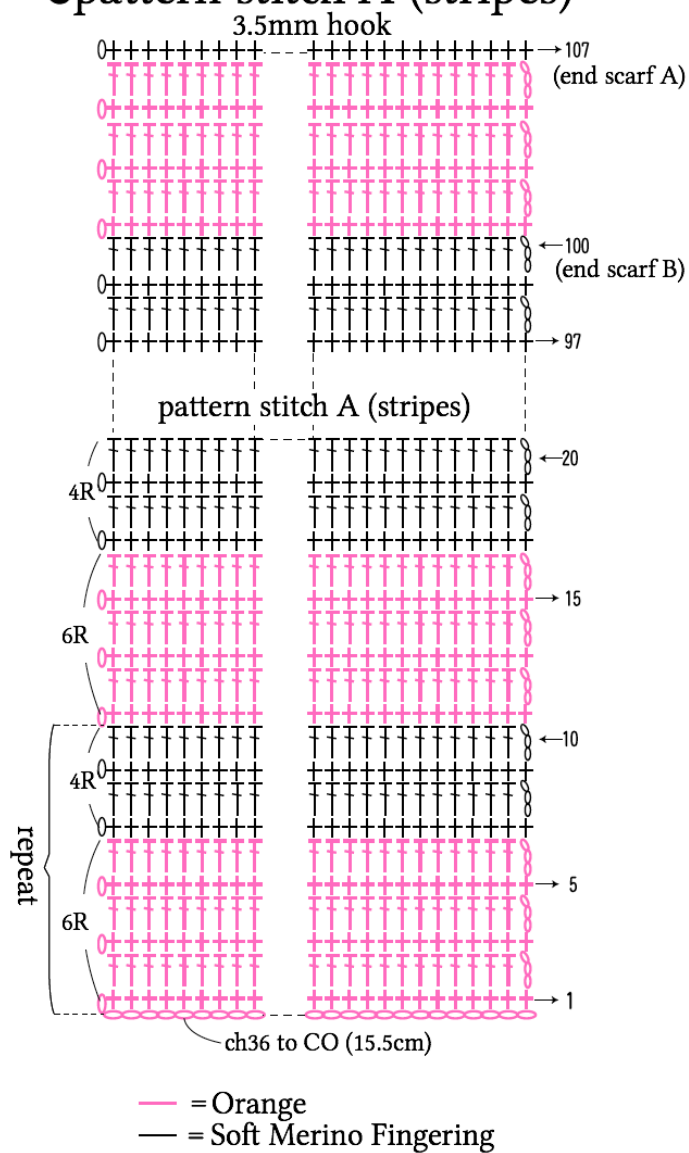
Scarf portion: Chain 36 to cast on and crochet scarf parts A and B in pattern stitch A (stripes), working their respective numbers of rows. When finished, align parts and seam with woven seam. With right sides together, form scarf into cylinder as follows: align both edges, join with slip/chain seam (see below) from wrong side, and turn right side out.

Mittens: Chain 18 stitches; working into these new stitches and designated stitches on scarf, work in the round in pattern stitch B and single crochet (US). Work chain in place indicated in schematic, leaving a space open for the thumb. When finished, seam with woven seam. Working stitches into place designated for thumb, crochet thumb in the round. When finished, thread yarn through remaining stitches and cinch shut.

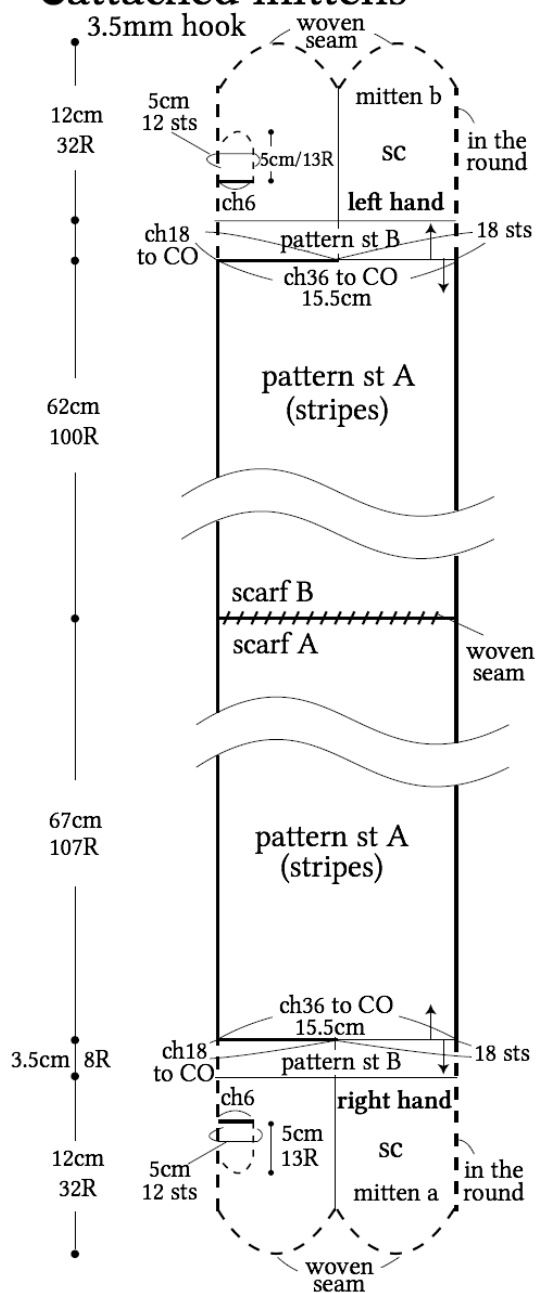
Abbreviations: ch = chain; CO = cast on; R = round(s)/row(s); sc = single crochet (US)

slip/chain seam: essentially a slip stitch seam with chain stitches interspersed between slip stitches. Sl st through one stitch in each layer being seamed. Working along edges of fabric, *ch1, sl st in top of next row*, continue from * to * until end.

● pattern stitch A (stripes)

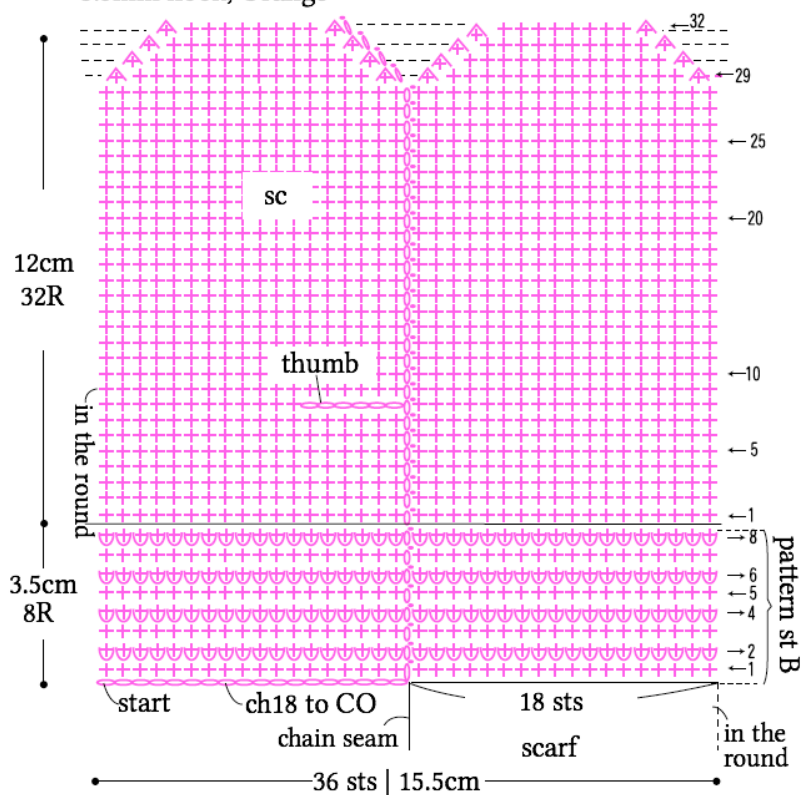

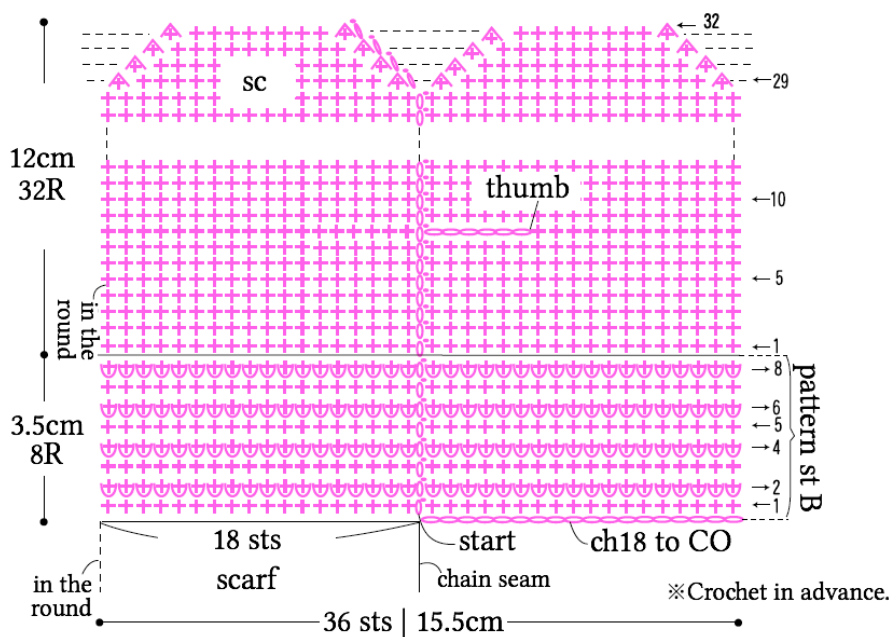
●mitten a: right hand

3.5mm hook, Orange

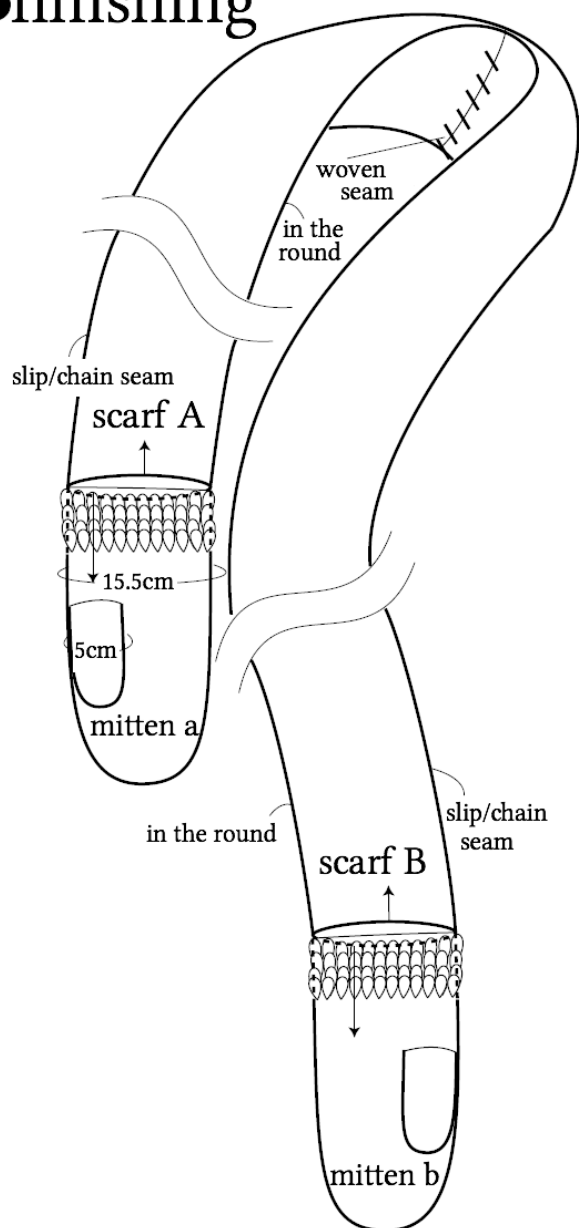


●mitten b: left hand

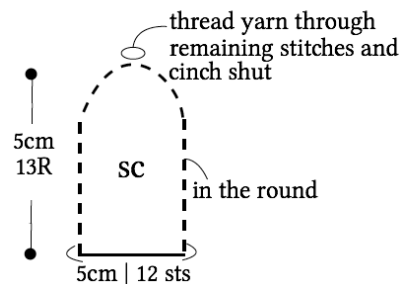


●finishing

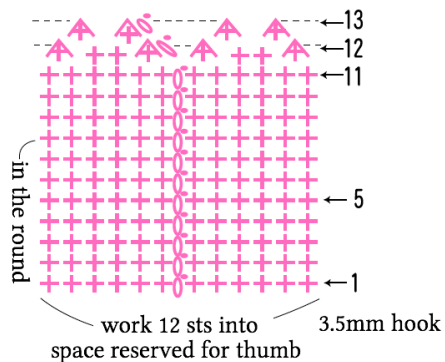


●thumb

thumb instructions



✚ single crochet loop stitch

※ Because the loop stitch forms loops on the *back (wrong) side*, change direction on even-numbered rows and crochet with wrong side facing.
