

211-22h Honwaka Cardigan



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Honwaka [100% cotton; 120 yds/110m per 1.23 oz./35g skein]; color #88 grage, 8 skeins [250g]

Tools/Notions:

- 3.0mm (US 2½) and 3.6mm (approx. US 4) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 5 buttons (20mm/0.79")

Finished measurements:

- bust 93cm/36.61"
- center back neck-to-cuff 42.5cm/16.73"
- length 58cm/22.83"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch: 24 sts and 32 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Knitting Tips

Front and back: Cast on with long-tail cast-on and work in k1p1 ribbing, then stockinette stitch. Shape raglan by binding off stitches underarm gusset, then decrease using k2tog or ssk at edges. For back piece, bind off neckline stitches. For front pieces, work plackets in k1p1 ribbing at the same time as the main knitting. For right front placket, work buttonholes where indicated.

Sleeves: Cast on as for body. Shape raglan seam as for body, by decreasing at edges with k2tog or ssk. Make left sleeve as mirror image of left sleeve.

Pockets: Cast on as for body and work in stockinette stitch. Use backwards-loop cast-on for increases. Work in k1p1 ribbing, then bind off with 1x1 tubular bind-off. Attach pockets to body where indicated.

Finishing: Seam underarm gusset with stitches-to-rows woven seam, and seam raglan edges with mattress stitch. Seam sides and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch. Pick up stitches around neckline (from back, front, and sleeves) and work in k1p1 ribbing. Bind off with 1x1 tubular bind-off. Attach buttons.
