

212fw-01 Cocoon Coat



Suggested yarn:

- Filatura Botto Poala Cocoon [80% merino, 20% nylon; 137 yds/125m per 1.76 oz./50g skein]; color #05 mustard, 8 skeins [395g]

Tools/Notions:

- 4.2mm (approx. US 6), 4.5mm (US 7), and 5.1mm (approx. US 8) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 6 buttons (30mm/1.18" diameter)
- 1 snap (12mm/0.47" diameter)

Finished measurements:

- bust 98cm/38.58"
- cross back width 37cm/14.57"
- length 80cm/31.50"
- sleeve length 55cm/21.65"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch and pattern stitch: 17 sts and 21 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Knitting Tips

Back & front body: Cast on for back with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k2p2 ribbing, stockinette stitch, and pattern stitch, changing needle size when indicated. Knit front pieces in the same way. Pick up stitches from front center; work buttonbands in k2p2 ribbing, placing buttonholes in right front band. Bind off in pattern.

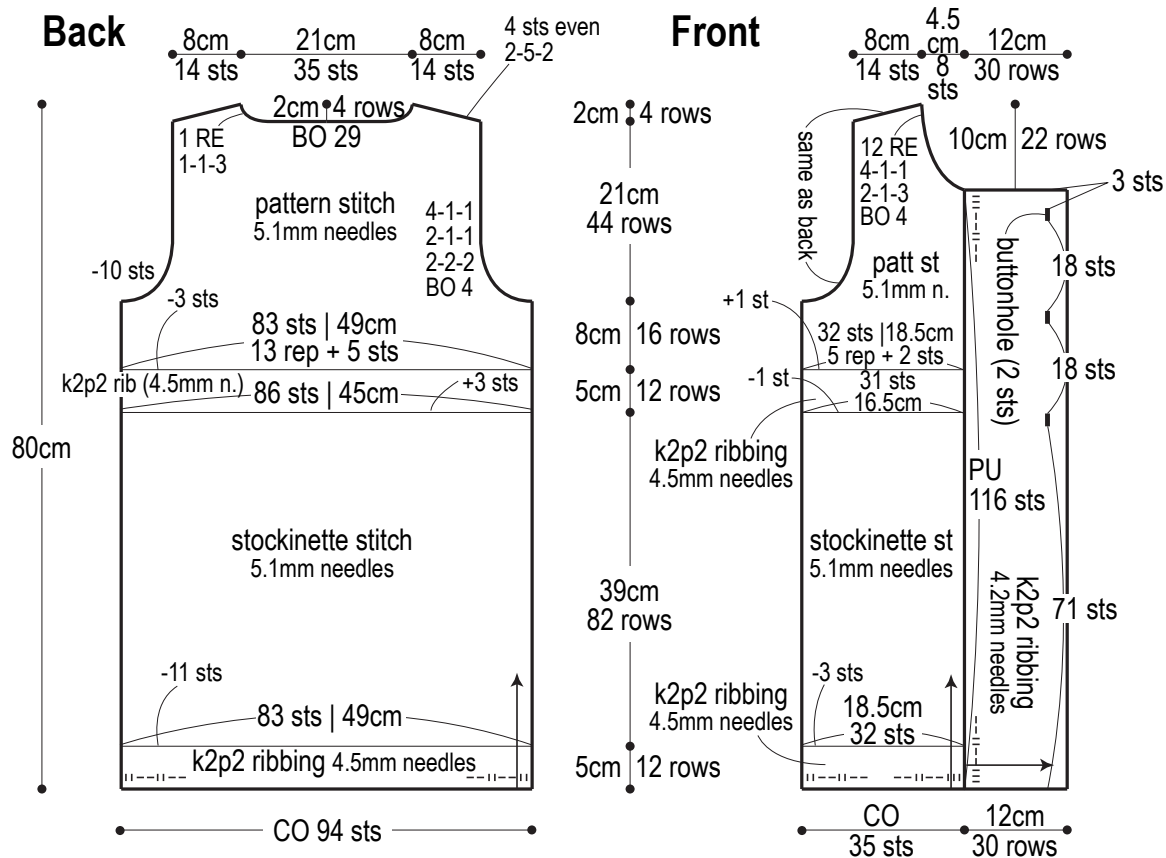
Sleeves: Cast on for back with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k2p2 ribbing and stockinette stitch.

Finishing: Seam shoulders with crochet slip stitch seam. Seam sides and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch. Seam sleeves to body with crochet slip stitch seam. Pick up stitches around edge of buttonbands and neckline; work collar in k2p2 ribbing. Fasten buttons to buttonband.

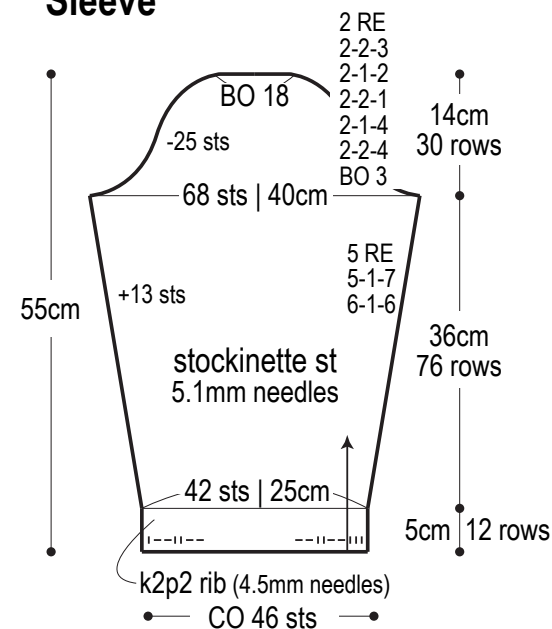
※Measurements are meant to account for stretching of the k2p2 buttonbands worked sideways.

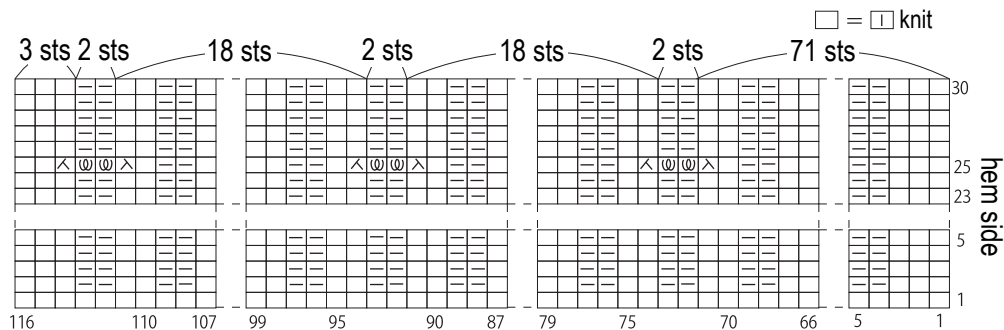
BO = bind off CO = cast on PU = pick up RE = row(s) even rep = repeat(s) ### = rows-stitches-times



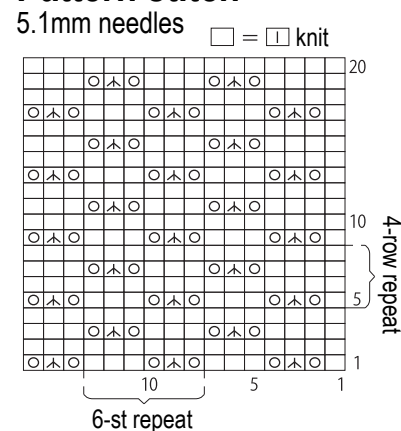
Sleeve



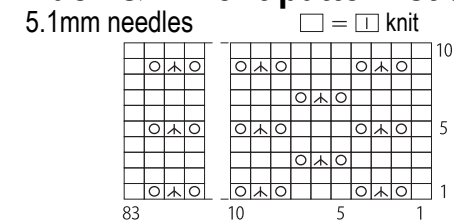
Buttonholes (right front band) 4.2mm needles



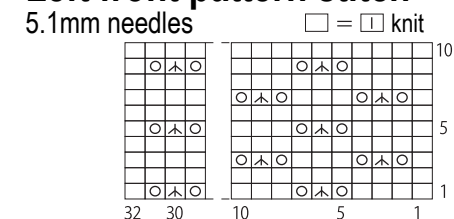
Pattern stitch



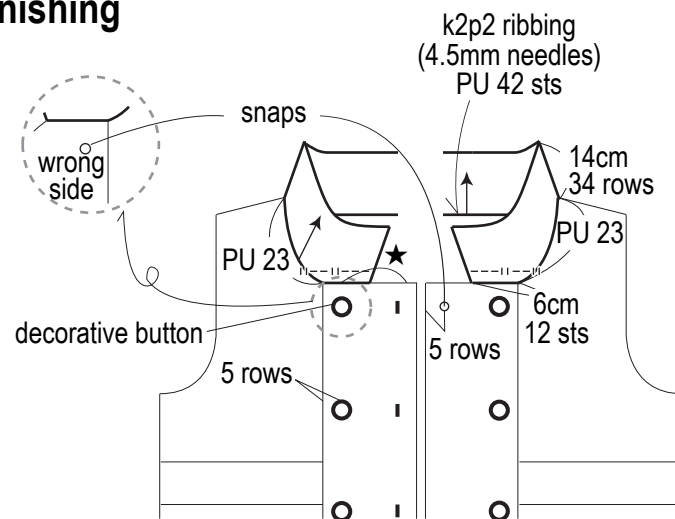
Back & R front pattern stitch
