

# 212fw-38 Cowichan Jacket



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Nordic Super Bulky [100% wool; 58 yds/53m per 2.82 oz./80g skein];
  - color #51 ivory, 8 skeins [570g]
  - color #52 greige, 5 skeins [390g]
  - color #54 dark brown, 1 skein [50g]
  - color #55 wine red, 1 skein [25g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 6.6mm (approx. US 10½) and 8.0mm (US 11) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 5 buttons (30mm/1.18" diameter)

## Finished measurements:

- chest 103cm/40.55"
- center back neck-to-cuff 73.5cm/28.94"
- length 64cm/25.20"

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stranded pattern stitch: 12 sts and 14 rows

*Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Knitting Tips

**Back & front body:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing, then stranded pattern stitch (inspired by Cowichan patterns). For front, work buttonbands and collar in garter stitch at the same time as the body, being sure to work buttonholes in left buttonband as you go. Shape raglan edges by working decreases at the edges.

**Sleeves:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing, then stranded pattern stitch. Shape sleeve cap by working decreases at the edges.

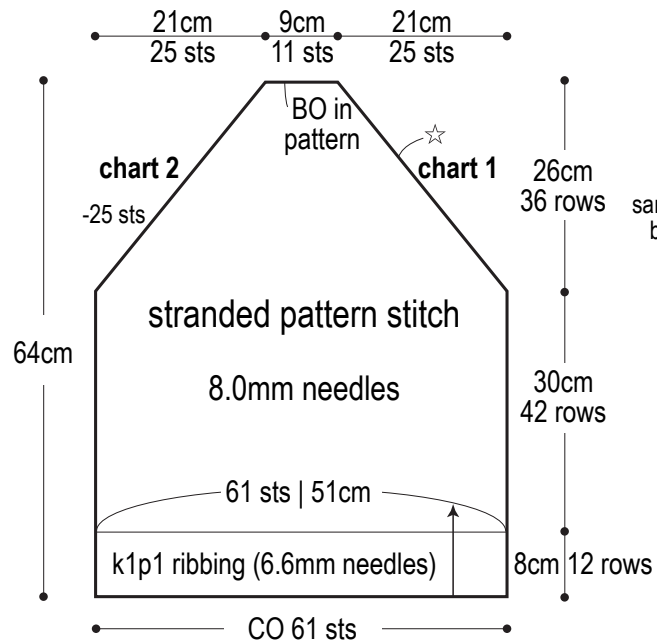
**Back collar:** Seam raglan edges of back body and sleeve using mattress stitch (worked 1 stitch in from the edge). Looking at right side of body, pick up stitches and work collar in garter stitch.

**Finishing:** Seam sides and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch (worked 1 stitch in from the edge). Align back collar and front collar where marked; seam with stitches-to-rows mattress stitch. Fasten buttons where indicated.

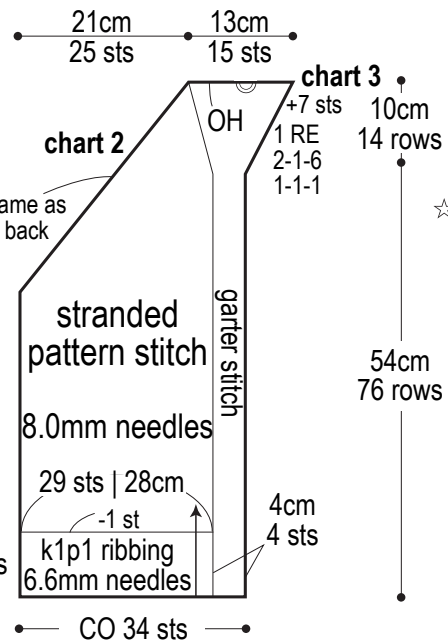

BO = bind off    CO = cast on    OH = on hold (i.e., place on stitch holder)    PU = pick up    RE = row(s) even    sl st = slip stitch    #-#-# = rows-stitches-times

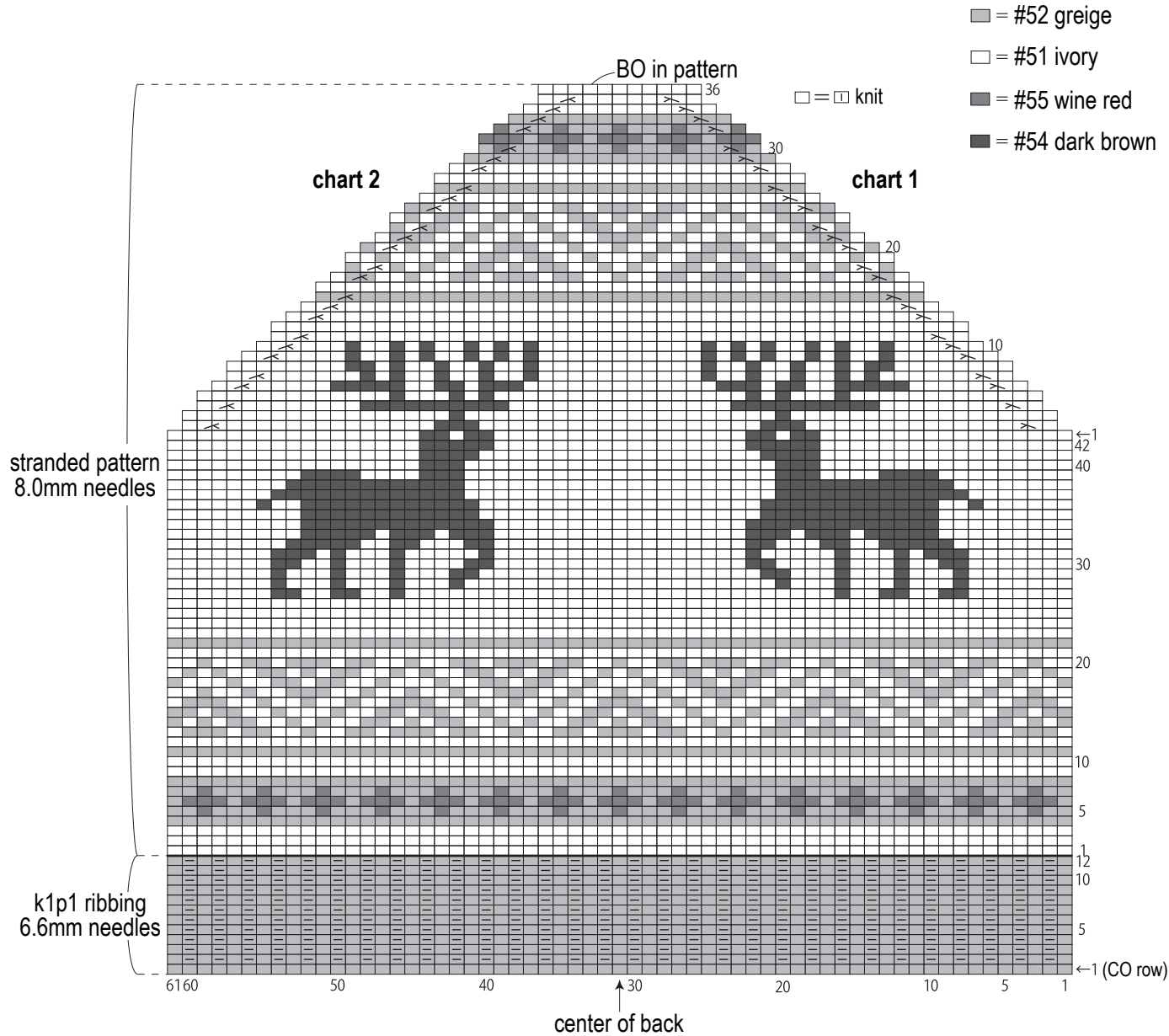


※Because the yarn is thick, the finished measurements are somewhat smaller in order to accommodate the seam allowance.

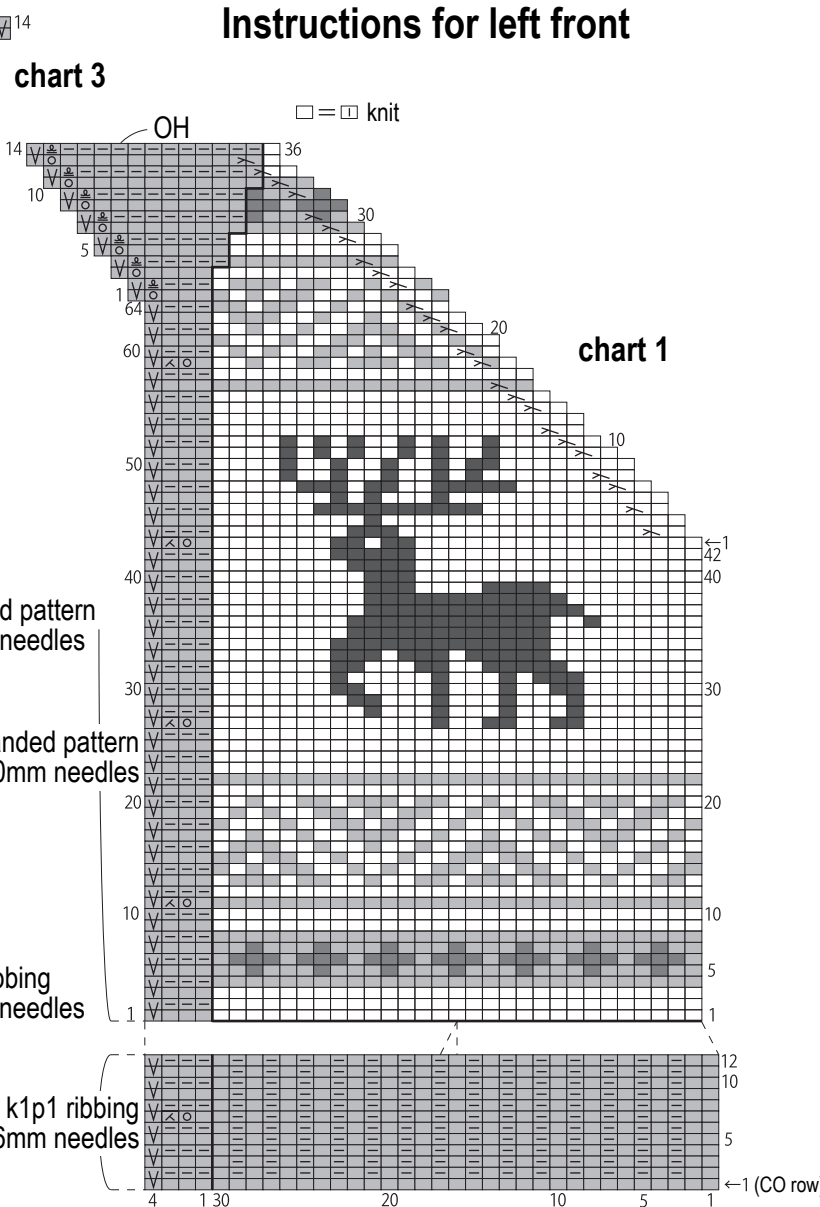

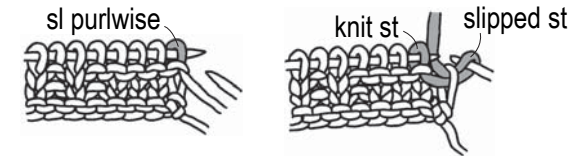
## Instructions for sleeves



## Left front (slip stitch) instructions

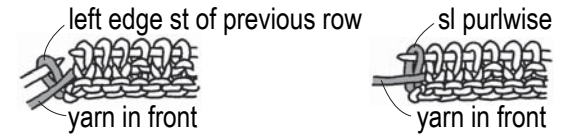


- ① Work second row with wrong side facing you. Bring yarn forward; sl st at edge purlwise.

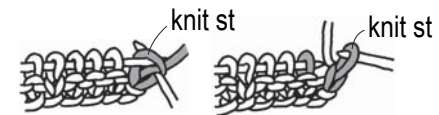


- ② Work fourth row as follows: bring yarn to front as in step ①. Slip first stitch purlwise.

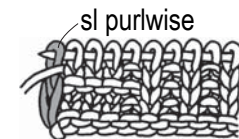
## Right front (slip stitch) instructions



- ① Work second row with wrong side facing you. For last st, bring yarn forward; sl st at edge purlwise.



- ② Work third row as follows: Turn work. With right side facing you, knit first stitch at right edge.



- ③ Work fourth row as follows: bring yarn to front as in step ①. Slip leftmost stitch purlwise.
