

213fw-02 Flared Raglan Sweater



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Pure Wool Lace/Junmo Gokuboso [100% wool (of which 50% is merino wool); 820 yds/750m per 3.53 oz./100g cone]; color #404 beige, 1 cone [100g]
- Pierrot Yarns Cutie Mohair [28% kid mohair, 30% nylon, 28% acrylic, 14% wool; 339 yds/310m per 0.88 oz./25g skein]; color #42 smoke lime pink, 5 skeins [120g]

Tools/Notions:

- 3.9mm (approx. US 6) and 4.5mm (US 7) straight knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 3.9mm (approx. US 6) double-pointed knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- bust 90cm/35.43"
- center back neck-to-cuff 72.5cm/28.54"
- length 60.5cm/23.82"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch: 19.5 sts and 24 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Knitting Tips

✳️**Note:** Entire garment worked with 3 strands of yarn held together (1 strand of Pure Wool Lace and 2 strands of Cutie Mohair).

Back & front body: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing. Change needle size, then continue in stockinette stitch. Shape sides and raglan edges (armscye) by working fully fashioned decreases (2 stitches in from the edge).

Sleeve: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing. Change needle size, then continue in stockinette stitch. Shape sleeve edges and raglan edges (sleeve cap) by working fully fashioned decreases (2 stitches in from the edge).

Finishing: Seam sides, sleeve undersides, and raglan edges with mattress stitch. Seam underarm gusset with Kitchener stitch. Pick up stitches around neckline; work collar in k1p1 ribbing in the round. Bind off in pattern.

Abbreviations:

BO = bind off

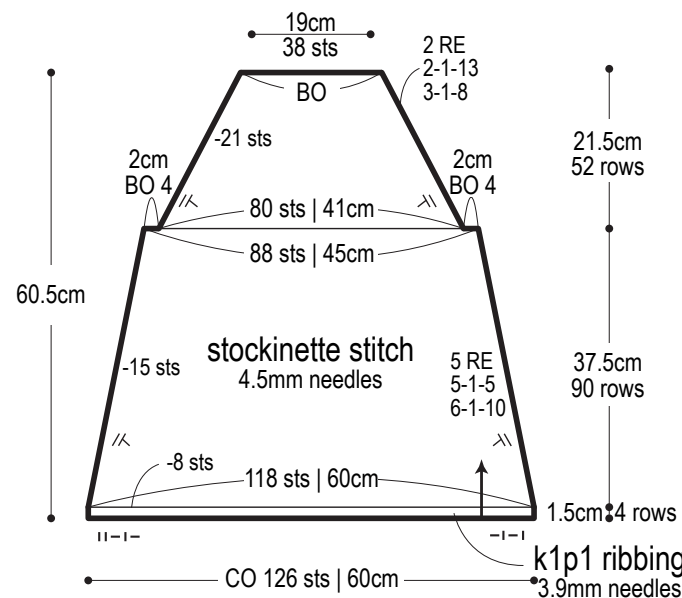
CO = cast on

PU = pick up

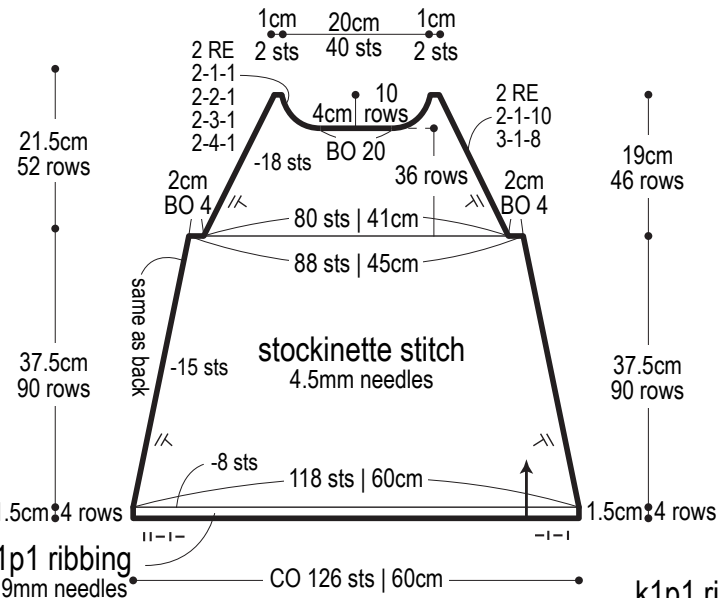
RE = row(s) even

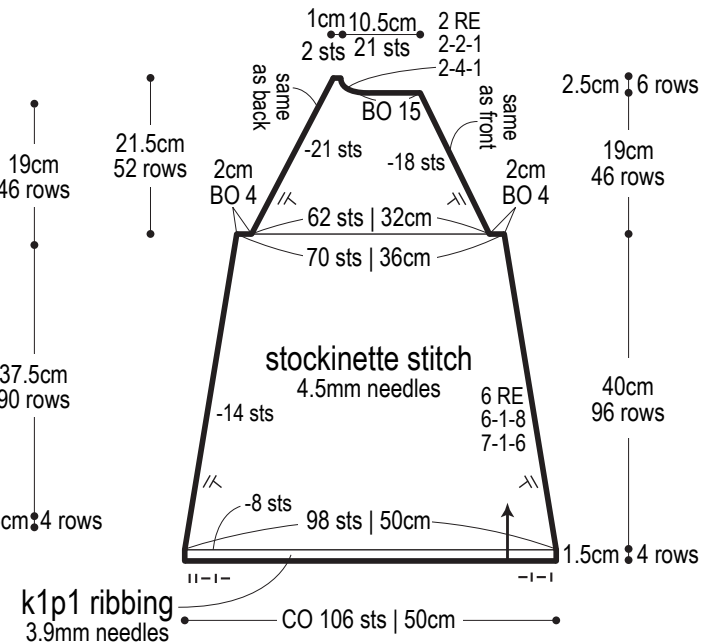


Front
