

213w-9 Orange Brioche Bag



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Orange [100% merino wool; 175 yds/160m per 1.76 oz./50g skein]; color #09 maroon/purple, 5 skeins [210g]

Tools/Notions:

- 3.3mm (approx. US 3) knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge
- 2.5mm (approx. US B or C) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge
- 1 pair brown polypropylene purse handles (approx. 39cm/15.35" long)

Finished measurements:

- width 40cm/15.75"
- length 28cm/11.02"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- pattern stitch: 17.5 sts and 33.5 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Knitting Tips

✳️**Note:** entire bag worked with 2 strands of yarn held together.

Bag: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work 7 rows in stockinette stitch and 5 rows in garter stitch. Continue in pattern stitch and garter stitch. Bind off in pattern. Pick up stitches along cast-on edge; work second half of bag in the same manner.

Finishing: Seam sides with mattress stitch. Sew bottom gusset corners as shown. Work sc up a column of purl stitches at side where indicated. Push sc column towards gusset section; whipstitch column (working through sc st and knitted fabric) so that it lies down flat. Sew handles to bag.

Abbreviations:

BO = bind off

CO = cast on

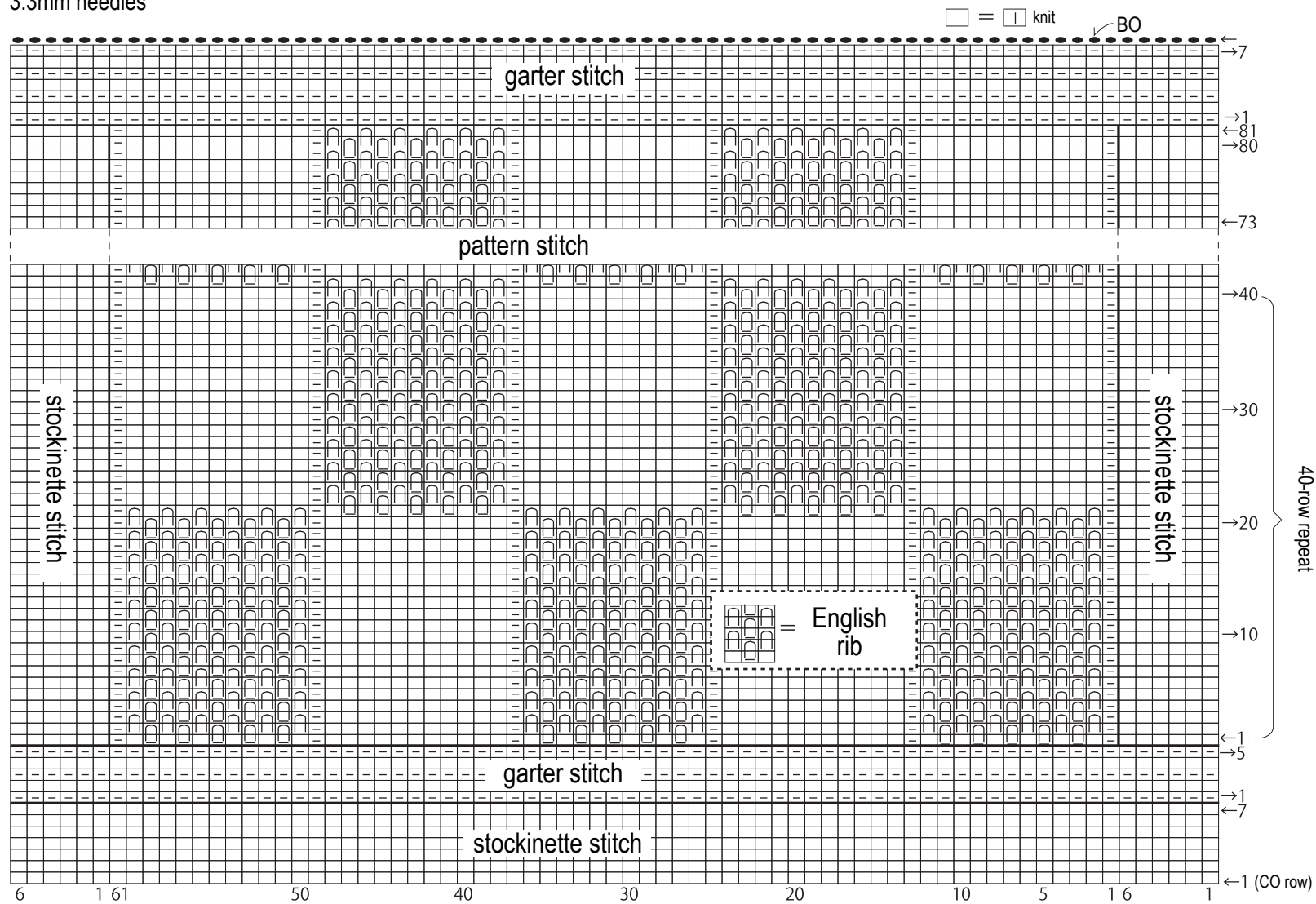
PU = pick up

sc = single crochet (US)

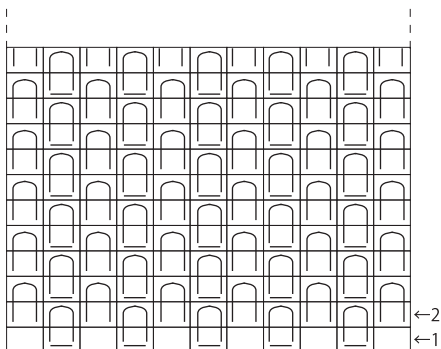
WS = wrong side

3.3mm needles



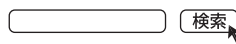
English rib

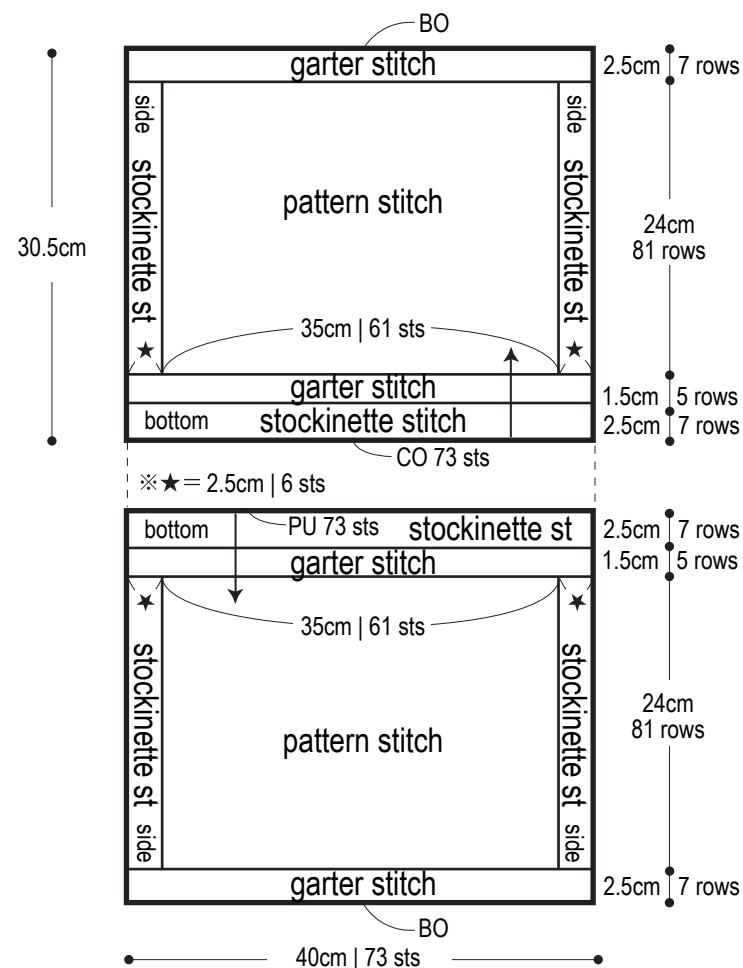

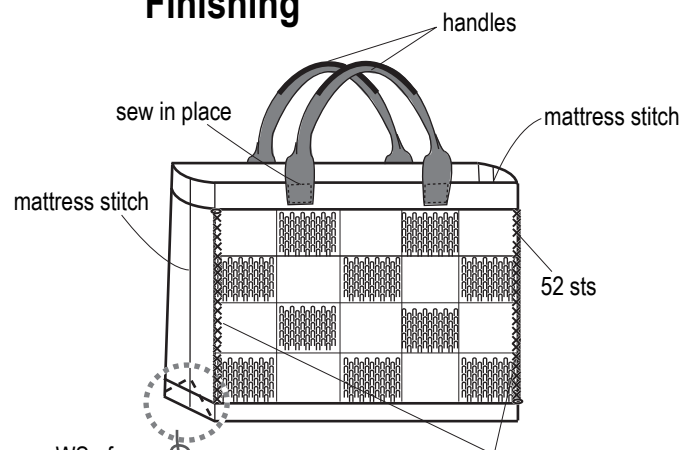


Bag schematic

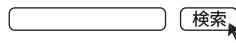
Finishing

Fold fabric in two, then work single crochet (US) with RS facing you with 2.5mm hook. After working sc, sew sc column to body of bag with whipstitch so that it lies down flat. See video tutorial using QR code at right.



Seam corners of both bottom edges together from wrong side.
