

612bag Amian Kinchaku Bag

SAMPLE BAG



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Amian [100% plant fiber; 94yds/86m per 1.41oz/40g skein];
 - color #22 teal green, 4 skeins [135g]
 - color #25 Naples yellow, 1 skein [25g]

Tools/Notions:

- 4.0mm (US G) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- mouth of bag (circumference): 70cm/27.56"
- depth: 19.5cm/7.68"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- single crochet (US) and pattern stitch: 18 sts and 20 rounds

Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

✳️**Note:** Like all Japanese patterns, stitch counts given here for foundation chains do **not** include any chain sts needed for turning posts.

Bottom: Create magic ring, then work sc in the round, increasing as indicated.

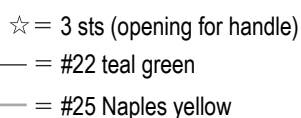
Side: Continuing from bottom, work in sc, then pattern stitch, then sc again. Work openings for handles on round 34.

Handle: Work foundation chain to begin, then work in sc. Thread handle piece through openings in side of bag, then whipstitch ends of handle together to create a loop.

Abbreviations:

ch = chain
magic ring
sc = single crochet (US)
