

# 214a-13 Boatneck Long Pullover



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Arles DK [100% baby alpaca; 133yds/122m per 1.76 oz./50g skein]; color #617 milk, 9 skeins [420g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 3.3mm (approx. US 4), 3.9mm (approx. US 6), 4.2mm (approx. US 6), and 4.5mm (US 7) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge

## Finished measurements:

- bust 90cm/35.43"
- cross back width 36cm/14.17"
- sleeve length 54cm/21.26"
- back length 75.5cm/29.72"

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- pattern stitch (with 3.9mm needles): 23.5 sts and 30.5 rows
- stockinette stitch: 22 sts and 30 rows

*Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Summary

**Back & front body:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Begin working sideways in pattern stitch. After knitting armscye, pick up stitches from crochet chain (worked in advance for this purpose). Work in k1p1 ribbing and pattern stitch. After working sideways to opposite shoulder, bind off stitches, bind off stitches as indicated and shape armscye. Bind off loosely. Make second piece identical to the first. Place markers for neckline. Begin lower body as follows: pick up stitches from ends of designated rows, then work in pattern stitch (changing needle size when indicated to alter gauge). Bind off. Pick up stitches from bound-off edge and work edging in k1p1 ribbing. Bind off in pattern.


**Sleeve:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing and stockinette stitch.

**Finishing:** Seam row-wise sides, shoulders, and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch. Seam stitch-wise sides using crochet slip stitch seam. Seam sleeves to body with crochet slip stitch seam.


## Abbreviations:

BO = bind off    ch = chain stitch    CO = cast on    pm = place marker    PU = pick up    RE = row(s) even    #-#-# = rows-stitches-times



## Sleeve


