

# 214a-14 Napoleon Jacket



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Foire DK [100% wool; 90yds/82m per 1.41oz/40g skein];
  - medium: color #24 grage, 9 skeins [335g]
  - large: color #24 grage, 10 skeins [380g]
- Pierrot Yarns Macon [70% alpaca, 30% nylon; 80 yds/73m per 0.88oz/25g skein];
  - medium: color #22 geige grey, 10 skeins [235g]
  - large: color #22 beige grey, 11 skeins [270g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 5.4mm (approx. US 9) and 6.0mm (US 10) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 5.0mm (US H) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge
- 8 buttons (20mm/0.79")

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- pattern stitch: 13 sts and 19 rows

*Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Summary

※Note: entire garment worked with 2 strands of yarn held together (1 strand of Foire DK and 1 strand of Macon).

**Body & sleeves:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k1p1 ribbing. Continue in pattern stitch, working decreases in first row of pattern stitch. Shape sides and sleeve sides with lifted increases. Shape armhole, neckline, and sleeve caps by binding off stitches as indicated and by working decreases at the edges.

**Finishing:** Seam shoulders with crochet slip stitch seam. Crochet sc edging around front edges and neckline. Seam sides and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch. Seam sleeves to body with crochet slip stitch seam. Fold front edges outwards where indicated to create lapels, then fasten buttons in place through both layers of fabric (lapel and front).


## Abbreviations:

BO = bind off      CO = cast on      k = knit      p = purl      RE = row(s) even      sc = single crochet (US)      #-# = rows-stitches-times



Where only one set of numbers is given, it refers to both sizes.



## Right front




## Left front




= k1p1 ribbing

= 5.4mm needles





\*Fold 8cm section of front edge outwards. Fasten buttons through both layers of fabric (folded lapel and front).

## Sleeve
