214w-17 Gloves



Suggested varn:

- Pierrot Yarns Junmo Chuboso Gradation [50% merino wool, 50% other wool; 164yds/150m per 1.41oz/40g skein];
 - color #1414 coral/yellow variegated, 1 skein [15g]
- Pierrot Yarns Junmo Chuboso / Pure Wool Fingering [50% merino wool, 50% other wool; 164yds/150m per 1.41oz/40g skein];
 - color #301 off-white, 1 skein [small amount]
 - color #302 pale mint green, 1 skein [10g]
 - color #303 citron green, 1 skein [10g]

- color #314 cyan green, 1 skein [5g]
- color #325 night blue, 1 skein [10g]
- color #327 light brown, 1 skein [5g]

Tools/Notions:

• 2.7mm (approx. US 2) and 3.0mm (US 3) double-pointed knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

• palm circumference 19cm/7.48"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

• stranded pattern stitch & stockinette stitch: 31 sts and 40 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

Right hand: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work stripes in k1p1 ribbing, then continue in stranded pattern stitch in the round. On palm side of hand, work thumb stitches on waste yarn (to work thumb later).


Fingers (right hand): For each finger, pick up stitches where indicated and work stockinette stitch in the round. For index finger, increase with lifted increase and backwards loop cast-on increase. For middle and ring fingers, pick up stitches from backwards loop cast-on increases. For pinky finger, pick up stitches from backwards loop cast-on increase for ring finger. On last round of each finger, decrease with k2tog, then cut yarn and thread tail through remaining stitches and cinch shut. For thumb, remove waste yarn holding thumb stitches, picking up the thumb stitches as you go. Work thumb in stockinette stitch in the round. Bind off as for other fingers.

Left hand: work as for right hand, reversing shaping.


blco = backwards loop cast-on increase CO = cast on k = knit k2tog = knit 2 sts together p = purl PU = pick up rep = pattern repeat(s)




Stranded pattern stitch 3.0mm double-pointed needles





How to work the area between fingers




① Work blco to bridge the gap between the index finger stitches (thus forming a tube).



② For the next finger, PU st from blco increase used for previous finger. Then use blco on opposite site to form a tube for the finger currently in work.

• = st worked into blco increase

From index finger to pinky finger, you will bridge the gap between stitches using blco. When working the next finger, you will pick up a st from that increase. Use these QR codes on your smartphone to view videos about how to work the index, middle, ring, and pinky fingers.



Thumb instructions


*Note: reference example here uses 4 sts on waste yarn. You will actually need 8 sts on waste yarn for this pair of gloves.






① On palm side, knit thumb sts with waste yarn rather than main yarn.



② Return the 4 sts knit with waste yarn to left needle. Knit across with main yarn.




3 Continue on with knitting.







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
Pick up stitches for thumb
