

214w-03 Low-gauge Sweater



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Basic Bulky [100% merino wool; 49 yds/45m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #1 ivory, 12 skeins [480g]

Tools/Notions:

- 15.0mm (US 19) knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- bust 116cm/45.67"
- center back neck-to-cuff 69cm/27.17"
- back length 42cm/16.54"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch: 6 sts and 9.5 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

✳️**Note:** Entire garment worked with 2 strands of yarn held together. Use only 1 strand of yarn for mattress stitch seams.

Back & front body: Cast on loosely with crochet chain cast-on method (using same yarn as for sweater). Work in stockinette stitch. Seam shoulders with crochet slip stitch seam.

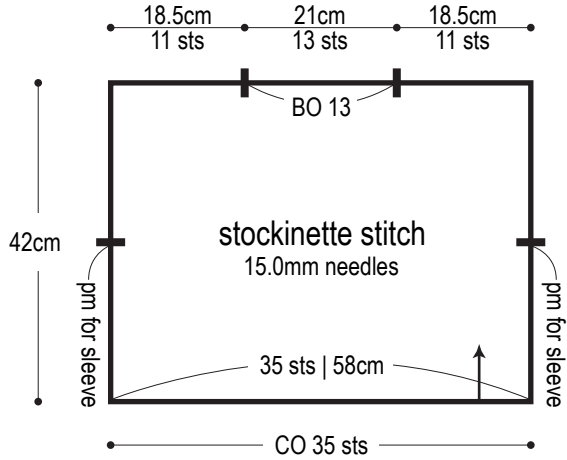
Sleeves: Pick up stitches along armhole (from shoulder to underarm marker), being sure to pick up only half of each stitch. Work sleeve flat in stockinette stitch, decreasing at edges as you work towards cuff. Bind off loosely.

Finishing: Seam sides and sleeve undersides with mattress stitch, using only 1 strand of yarn and working through half stitches only to reduce bulk.

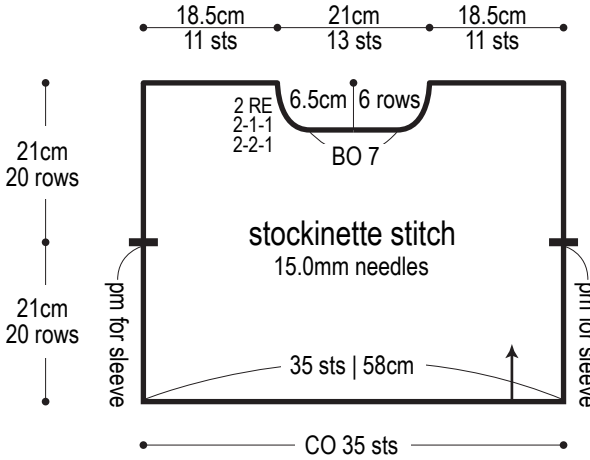
Abbreviations:

BO = bind off CO = cast on pm = place marker PU = pick up RE = row(s) even #-#-# = rows-stitches-times

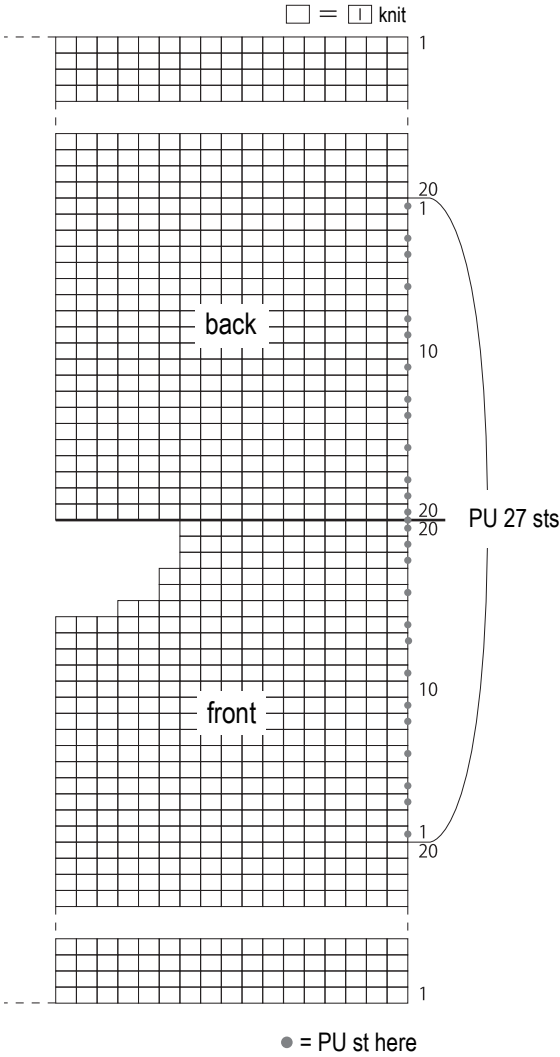

Front

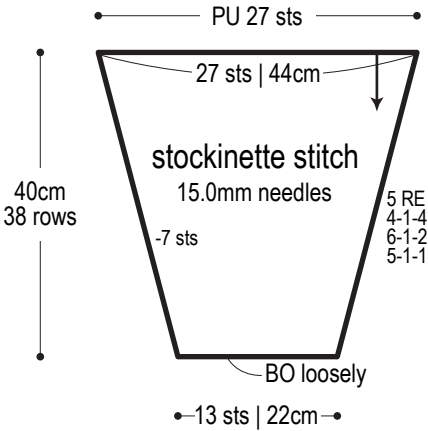


Picking up sleeves
