214w-14 Cushions



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Nordic [100% wool; 131 yds./120m per 2.82 oz./80g skein];
 - square cushion: color #01 ivory, 4 skeins [310g]
 - rectangle cushion: color #11 smoke Vermillion, 2 skeins [160g]
 - tori (bird) cushion: color #14 north blue, 2 skeins [155g]

Tools/Notions:

- 5.4mm (approx. US 9) knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge
- 4.0mm (US G) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge
- polyfiber stuffing (approx. 70g)
- tori (bird cushion): 1 piece navy blue broadcloth, 90cm/35.43" wide by 30cm/11.81" long
- rectangle cushion: pillow form 45cm/17.72" x 27cm/10.63"
- square cushion: pillow form 45cm/17.72" x 45cm/17.72"

Finished measurements:

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

seed stitch: 15 sts and 25 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

Cushion: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work 2 pieces per cushion in seed stitch. Bind off.

Finishing: For square and rectangle cushions, place 2 pieces together with wrong sides facing each other. Seam 3 sides by working sc edging through both layers. Insert pillow form, then seam remaining side with sc as for the first 3 sides. For the tori (bird) cushion, place knitted fabric and broadclothes pieces of the same size together, then draw bird shape on top layer using 1/4 scale bird template (enlarge to scale first). As shown in finishing schematic, sew along bird shape drawn on fabric, leaving 10cm/4" at bottom unseamed. Turn cushion right-side out, then insert stuffing. Seam open 10cm/4" section with mattress stitch or ladder stitch.









Tori (bird) finishing
