

Merisilk Hat



Suggested yarn:

- Keito-Zakka Stores Merino Warm DK [60% wool, 40% merino wool; 96 yds./88m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #41 off-white, 2 skeins [70g]
- Grignasco Merisilk [80% merino wool, 20% silk; 273 yds./250m per 1.76 oz./50g skein]; color #1 rainbow, 1 skein [50g]

Tools/Notions:

- 3.6mm (approx. US 5) and 4.2mm (approx. US 6) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- head circumference 57cm/22.44"
- depth 22.5cm/8.56"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stranded pattern stitch: 23 sts and 24 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

✳️**Note:** When using Merisilk, use 2 strands of yarn held together. When using Merino Warm DK, use just 1 strand.

Hat: Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k2p2 ribbing, then in stranded pattern stitch. Continue in stockinette stitch, working evenly spaced decreases as indicated. After last row, cut yarn and thread tail through remaining stitches and cinch shut. Seam sides of hat with mattress stitch. Make pompom and fasten to top of hat.

Abbreviations:

CO = cast on

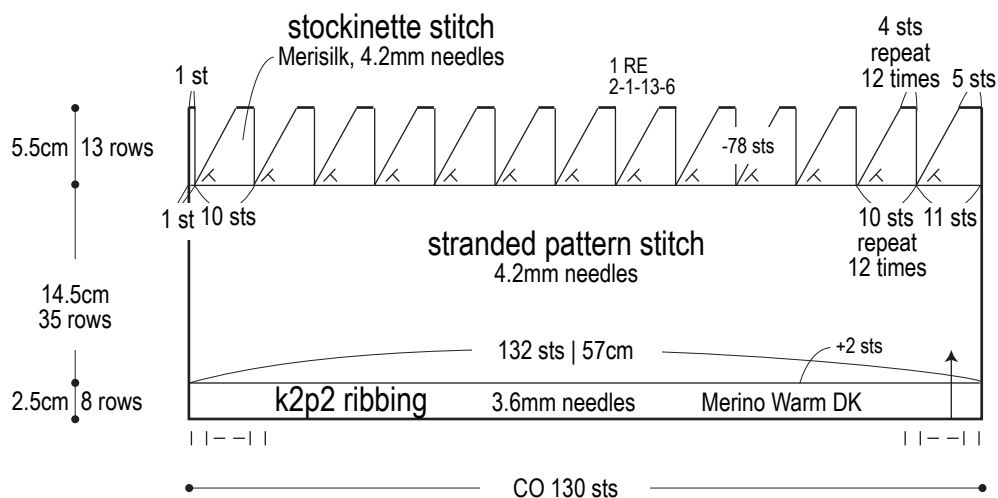
k = knit

p = purl

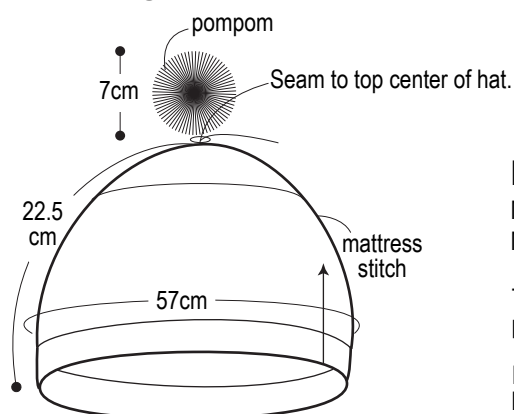
RE = row(s) even

= rows-stitches-places-times [for evenly spaced decreases across entire width of an item]. For example, 1-2-3-4 means "every 1 row, decrease 2 stitches in each of 3 places across the row; do this 4 times total."

Finishing



Pompom:

Merisilk: 2 strands
Merino Warm DK: 1 strand } 3 strands

To make pompom, wrap 3 strands around a piece of cardboard 8cm wide 100 times.

In the event that you don't have enough Merisilk left for the pompom, either use more strands of Merino Warm DK or wrap yarn more times.

Stranded pattern stitch 4.2mm needles
