Suggested yarn:

• Pierrot Yarns Heat+ [100% polyester; 113 yds./103m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #08 dark gray, 4 skeins [130g]

Tools/Notions:

- 2.5mm (approx. US B or C) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge
- corrugated cardboard or thick paper such as cardstock
- light fixture up to 4cm/1.57" in diameter

Finished measurements:

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

• No gauge information is provided in the original pattern. Use hook size necessary to achieve the desired finished measurements.

Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

*Note: Like all Japanese patterns, stitch counts given here for foundation chains do not include any chain sts needed for turning posts.


Shade panels: ch29 to begin, then work lower section in pattern stitch. Working into foundation chain for lower section, continue to upper section. Make 6 of the same panel.

Finishing: Lightly iron the 6 panels without steam, blocking all to the same size. Seam the 6 panels together 2 at a time with wrong sides facing each other (that is, right side out) using single crochet (US). Create a hexagonal lampshade shape with cardboard, then place the lampshade over the cardboard. Apply steam with iron. Remove cardboard after yarn has stiffened. Crochet cord and thread through opening in upper section. Use cord to fasten light fixture in place.



HEAT+ stiffening method (using steam iron) Lightly iron dry fabric without steam. Hold iron slightly above fabric; steam thoroughly. dc = double crochet (US) *Adjust the fabric's degree of hardness by adjusting your steam dc dc stockinette st iron's settings. The temperature (wrong side) stockinette st (wrong side) setting needed to produce steam (wrong side) (wrong side) may vary from medium to high heat depending on your iron. When the fabric has been thoroughly stiffened, it will shrink about 10%. Amount of shrinkage will depend on individual stitches and stitch patterns. Iron directly on top of flat knitted or crocheted fabric. If the fabric is not uniform, stretch the fabric into shape. *Set iron to medium heat.
