

# 215aw-06 Airy Vest



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Whips [58% acrylic, 30% nylon, 12% wool; 175 yds/160m per 1.41 oz./40g skein];
  - ladies' size: color #06 light gray, 4 skeins [140g]
  - kids' size: color #06 light gray, 2 skeins [75g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 5.1mm (approx. US 8) and 5.4mm (approx. US 9) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- 4.0mm (US G) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

## Finished measurements:

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- pattern stitch (with smaller needles): 19 sts and 20 rows
- pattern stitch (with larger needles): 17.5 sts and 18 rows

*Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Summary

**Body:** Cast on with long-tail cast-on method. Work in pattern stitch, changing needle size when indicated to alter gauge. Shape armhole by binding off stitches as indicated and by working fully fashioned decreases (1 st in from the edge). Collar is worked as continuation of body, but on first row of collar, increase 1 stitch at each side to create a seam allowance.

**Finishing:** Seam shoulders with crochet slip stitch. Seam sides of body and sides of collar with mattress stitch. Work 1 round of sc edging around hem and each armhole.

## Abbreviations:

BO = bind off    CO = cast on    RE = row(s) even    rep = pattern repeat(s)    sc = single crochet (US)    #-#-# = rows-stitches-times




## Front & back

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

## Hem & armhole sc edging


4.0mm hook




# Pattern stitch

※See schematic for information about when to change needle size to alter gauge.


□ = □ knit




■ = 1 repeat  
= (3 sts & 4 rows)




## instructions




Insert R hook into space between 3rd and 4th sts on L needle; pull up a loop.




Knit the next 3 sts normally.



On next row, purl until 1 st before the loop from previous row. Insert R needle into these two sts (st + loop) as indicated by arrow.



Purl these sts together.



This is how finished stitch pattern should look from the right side.
