z241-1-bag Round Bottom Tote



Suggested yarn:

- Keito-Zakka Stores Clair Jute [98% jute, 1% polyester, 1% nylon; 92 yds/84m per 3.53 oz./ 100g hank];
 - color #01 milky white, 4 hanks [385g]
 - color #10 chat noir, 1 hank [30g]

Tools/Notions:

• 3.5mm (US E) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- height 30cm/11.81"
- opening circumference 90cm/35.43"
- base radius 20cm/7.87"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

• single crochet (US) stitch: 15 sts and 16 rounds

Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

Bottom: Work magic ring to begin, then work in sc in the round, increasing as indicated.

Sides: Continue from bottom to sides by working 1 round of sc tbl. Continue in sc in the round, increasing as indicated.

Handle (make 2): Use 18 strands of color #10 for core of handle. With 2 additional strands of color #10, work buttonhole stitch around the 18 strands of core to make handle (see schematics for details).

Finishing: Seam handles to bag where indicated. Create tassel and secure to handle.

Abbreviations:


ch = chain


m = magic ring/circle

sc = single crochet (US)

sc tbl = single crochet (US) through back loop only


#-#-# = rounds-stitches-places-times [for evenly spaced decreases across entire round]. For example, 1-2-3-4 means "every 1 round, decrease 2 stitches in each of 3 places across the round; do this 4 times total."






Finishing

How to make handles (2) with buttonhole stitch




① Work buttonhole stitch around core as follows to encase it: pass needle behind core, then over yarn at top.




③ Reduce spaces between stitches so that core won't show between them.

○ How to make tassel color #10 chat noir

① Use 22 strands of yarn, each 30cm long. Fold strands in half, then place 35cm piece (folded in two) as shown to form loop.




② Gather remaining yarn into bundle. Tie knot at center, being sure to encompass piece used for loop so it will be secured.



3 Fold back section A.



④ Tie a knot 1.5cm below top of folded-down section A.
