

610pouch Beaded Pouch



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Cotton Lace #40 [100% cotton; 339 yds/310m per 1.41 oz./40g skein];
 - color #401 white, 1 skein [15g]
- Pierrot Yarns Casual Cotton [100% cotton; 120 yds/110m per 1.06 oz./30g skein];
 - color #07 light lemon space-dyed, 1 skein [30g]

Tools/Notions:

- 2.3mm (approx. US B) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge
- darning needle
- 4mm/0.16" beads
- cord for shoulder strap 1m/39.37"
- 1 button 1cm/0.39"

Finished measurements:

- depth 13.5cm/5.31"
- length 11cm/4.33"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- single crochet (US) stitch: 26 sts and 30 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

✳️**Note:** Like all Japanese patterns, stitch counts given here for foundation chains do not include any chain sts needed for turning posts.

Body: Thread beads onto Cotton Lace #40 in advance. With 2 strands held together (1 strand of Casual Cotton and 1 strand of Cotton Lace #40), work foundation chain to begin. Work in sc according to chart and schematic. Wherever a bead is desired, slip bead into stitch.

Finishing: Work 1 row of edging along edges of flap. Make button loop by working a chain and attaching it to flap such that seam doesn't show on right side. Fasten button to body of pouch. Attach straps to body of pouch.

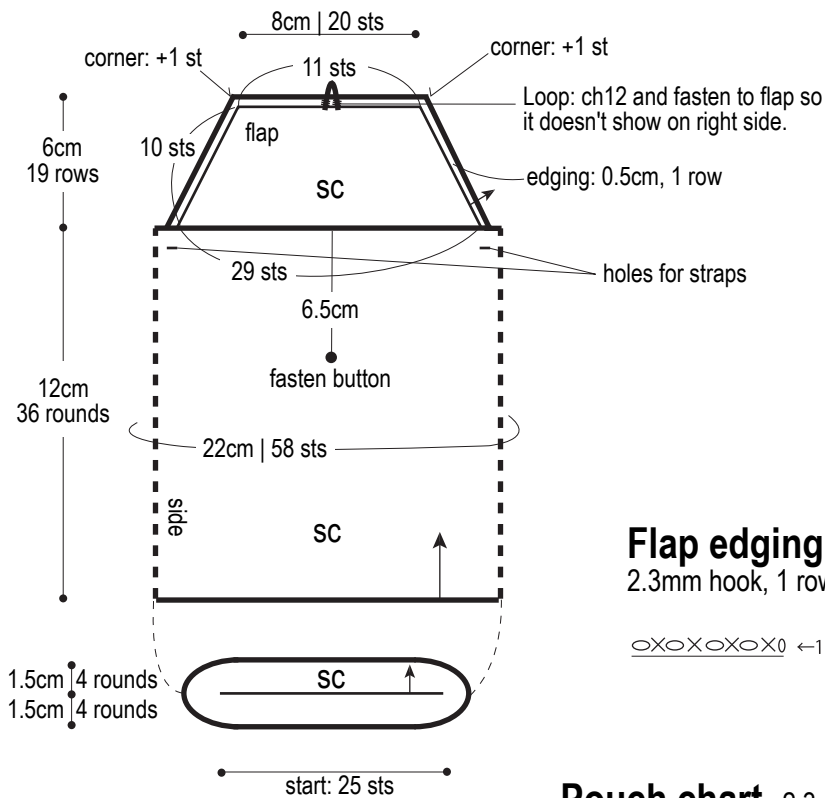

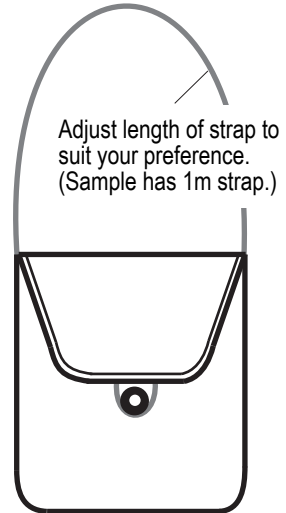
sc = single crochet (US)

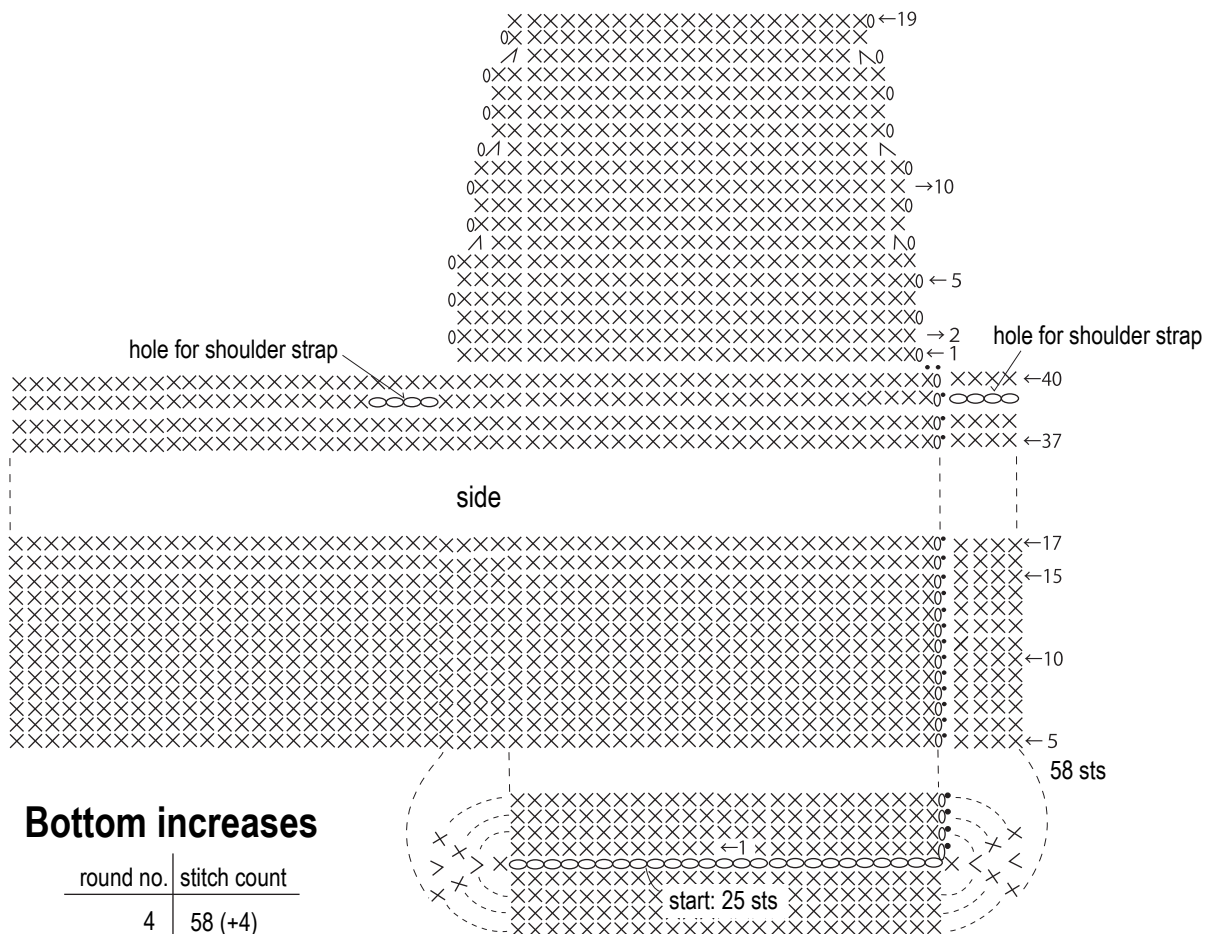
