

218aw-04 Frill Sweater



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Soft Merino [100% merino wool; 104 yds/95m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #6 light beige, 8 skeins [300g]
- Pierrot Yarns Hensel [80% mohair, 20% silk; 120 yds/110m per 0.71 oz./20g skein]; color #1 ivory, 6 skeins [120g]

Tools/Notions:

- 5.1mm (approx. US 8) knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge
- 5.0mm (US H) crochet hook or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- bust 90cm/35.4"
- center back neck-to-cuff 62.5cm/24.6"
- back length 55.5cm/21.9"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- reverse stockinette stitch: 15 sts and 20 rows
- pattern stitch A: 14 sts and 20 rows
- pattern stitch B: 14 sts and 21 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

✳️**Note:** entire garment worked with 2 strands of yarn held together (1 strand of each yarn).

Back & sleeves: Cast on with crochet provisional cast-on method. With knitting needles, pick up stitches from bottom loops of crochet chain. Work in reverse st st. Shape raglan edges by binding off stitches where indicated and by working fully fashioned decreases 3 sts in from the edge. Remove provisional cast-on edge, and with crochet hook, work pattern stitch B starting from cast-on edge.

Front: Cast on as for back & sleeves. Work as for back, except that you still work a panel of pattern stitch A at the center (see schematic) in addition to the st st. Remove provisional cast-on edge, and with crochet hook, work pattern stitch B starting from cast-on edge.

Finishing: Seam raglan edges with mattress stitch. Seam underarm gusset with reverse st st Kitchener stitch. Seam sides and sleeves with one continuous mattress stitch seam per side of body/sleeve, except for pattern stitch B section, which should be seamed with whipstitch. Crochet edging around neckline in the round.

Abbreviations:

BO = bind off CO = cast on RE = row(s) even sc = single crochet (US) st st = stockinette stitch #-#-# = rows-stitches-times

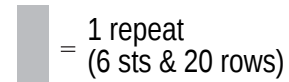

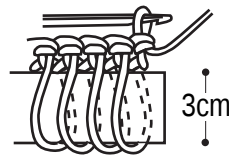

✱Note that loops are formed on the wrong side of the fabric.



We suggest that rather than working loops around your finger, you use a piece of cardboard 3cm wide to ensure uniform loop size.
