

# 219AW-18 Amigurumi Sheep



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Rabbits [43% mohair, 41% acrylic, 16% nylon; 63 yds/58m per 1.4 oz./40g skein]; color #02 Felice, 2 skeins [50g]
- Pierrot Yarns Junmo Chuboso/Pure Wool Fingering [40% merino wool, 60% punta wool; 164 yds/150m per 1.4 oz./40g skein]; color #401 white, 1 skein [20g]
- Pierrot Yarns Soft Merino [100% merino wool; 104 yds/95m per 1.4 oz./40g skein];
  - color #1 ivory, 1 skein [small amount]
  - color #6 light beige, 1 skein [10g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 3.5mm (US E) & 6.0mm (US J) crochet hooks or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- polyfiber filling
- 35cm/13.8" ribbon
- doll eyelashes (2)
- brown embroidery thread

## Finished measurements:

- Please see schematics.

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- No gauge information is provided in the original pattern. Use hook sizes necessary to achieve desired measurements.

*Gauge may vary according to individual crochet style. Change hook size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Summary

✳️**Note:** For parts crocheted in Rabbits or 2 strands of Junmo Chuboso held together, consider the wrong side the public side.

**Head, torso & tail:** For each piece, work magic ring to begin, then work sc in the round, increasing and decreasing as indicated in charts.

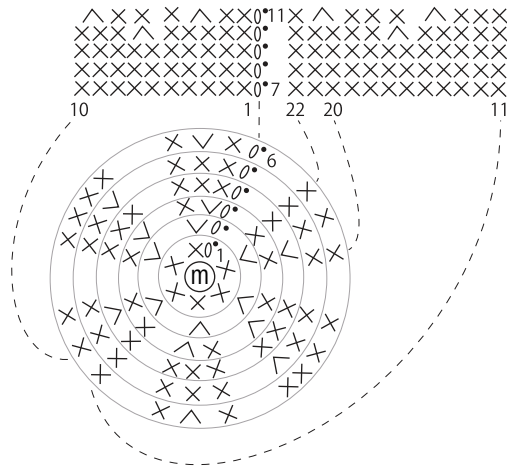
**Face, front legs, back legs, front feet, back feet & ears:** For each piece, work magic ring to begin, then work sc in the round, increasing as indicated in charts.

**Finishing:** Referring to finishing schematics, stuff each piece (except ears) with polyfiber filling, then seam using whipstitch. Attach eyelashes to face. Embroider nose and mouth on face. Fold each ear in two per finishing schematic, then whipstitch to head. Sew all remaining parts to torso using whipstitch. Tie ribbon around the sheep's neck using a bow knot.

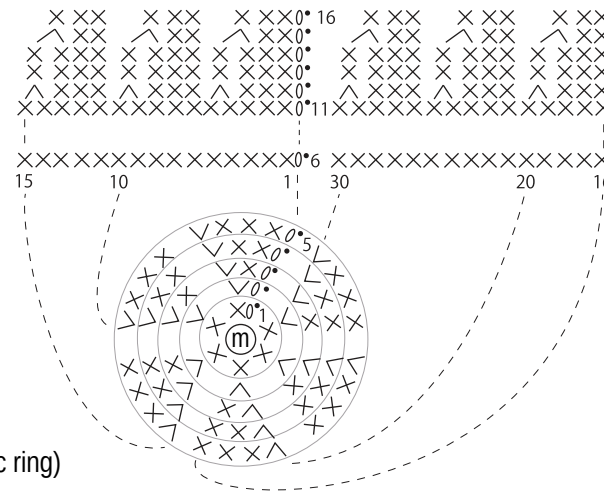

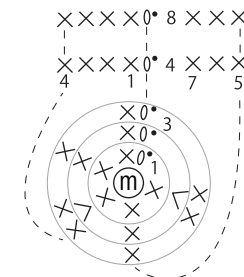

# Finishing



Insert a small amount of stuffing into each arm/leg, then place hoof piece on open end and seam with whipstitch.

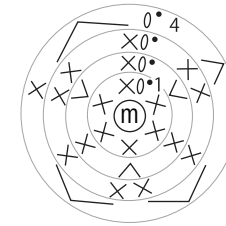


Insert stuffing into head and face & whipstitch together.

Insert a little stuffing into torso, then seam to head with whipstitch.

## Tail 6.0mm hook

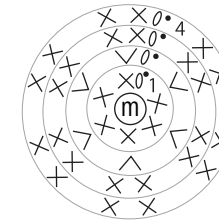
2 strands: Rabbits & Pure Wool Fingering

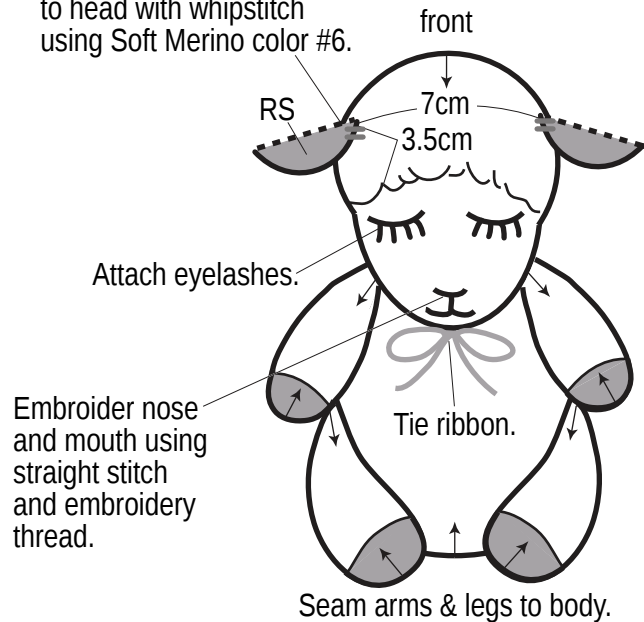
## Hooves (make 4) 3.5mm hook

Soft Merino color #6



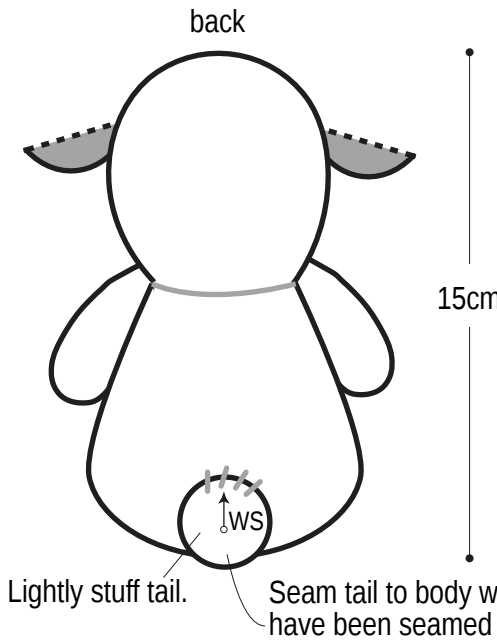

Fold ear in half, then seam to head with whipstitch using Soft Merino color #6.



Embroider nose and mouth using straight stitch and embroidery thread.

Seam arms & legs to body.

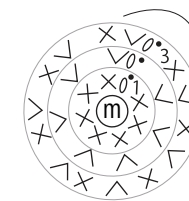


Lightly stuff tail.

Seam tail to body with whipstitch after legs have been seamed in seated position.

## Ears (make 2) 3.5mm hook
